# **Legislative and Regulatory Update**

Keeping you informed on what's happening in the Capitol.

This is the 3rd quarter issue of the newsletter and by now you probably are aware that the Legislature did pass the OTA version of a bill to modify the Oregon USF. As of now, all providers of retail telecommunications service are required to contribute to the Oregon USF. While there remains hard work and likely many months of effort at OPUC around this matter, the really hard part is done.

While the Oregon Legislature has met in Special Session over the past few months, our OTA issue was addressed in the first Special Session back in June. The Regular Session begins in January 2021 and we have already heard of at least one bill directly related to broadband that OTA will need to monitor. Other legislators have reached out as well to discuss potential broadband related issues for 2021.

Exactly how to hold a normal, regular session is still being worked out. Currently, no visitors are allowed in the Capitol building. That includes legislative Staff, the media and lobbyists. Setting aside the logistical problems and how on earth to lobby a bill when you can't meet with people, there are legitimate transparency and public access concerns that have to be dealt with. There are rumors that maybe the session will begin in January like normal but, actual legislative business wouldn't occur until perhaps April.


