Legislative Session Winding Down

The short session of the Oregon Legislature is beginning to wrap up business as this is being written. While there weren't many pieces of legislation for the OTA to track and monitor, there was one important bill we were fortunate enough to be invited to work on.

Senate Bill 1566 gives counties the authority to begin charging for permits for work in the right of way along county-maintained roads. While this might not sound like the kind legislation OTA should remain neutral on, the exemptions and other considerations gained were worth the effort. It is also worth noting that all the utilities were very clearly told that some kind of legislation was going to pass and were strongly encouraged to participate.

Briefly, here are the exemptions for which counties are not allowed to assess permit fees:

•Vegetation management or vegetation clearance maintenance, and the vegetation management or vegetation clearance maintenance is required by the Public Utility Commission

•Routine replacement or maintenance of a line, fixture or other facility, including but not limited to pole replacement

•Replacement or maintenance of a line, fixture or other facility required by the commission under ORS 757.035 or 757.039 or by a national electric safety code

•If the permit is for relocation of a line, fixture or other facility, and the relocation is required by the county •If the permit is for emergency or urgent work, regardless of the duration of time of the work, to restore or maintain services, and the emergency or urgent work is necessary to protect public health or safety.

The OTA and utilities worked to limit as much as possible the circumstances that would require any fee payment. In addition, we were able to secure a couple more things in the bill:

•Counties have 15 business days to issue or deny the permit once a complete application is received •The fee assessed cannot exceed \$500.00 (there is a CPI increase per year)

•This entire legislation will sunset and be repealed on January 2, 2031 (it will take effect as soon as it is signed into law)

There was also **House Bill 4040** that the OTA supported. Briefly, this bill amends the current law to eliminate the broadband application grant review committee in the Oregon Broadband Office (OBO). Instead, the Oregon Broadband Advisory Council (OBAC) will serve as the grant review committee. The OBO and Representative Pam Marsh both supported this change.

As usual, special thanks to our Legislative Committee and those who came to Salem for the annual Cooperative luncheon or otherwise took time to discuss issues. It takes a team effort to ensure our interests are being looked after in the Capitol.
