Wrapping Up the 2025 Legislative Session

As I'm sure you're all aware by now the legislative session ended with a bit chaos related to ODOT funding. For our members, we weathered the session fairly well. We had successes and a couple of let downs for sure.

There were no bills that related directly to broadband or telecommunications that passed which we didn't support or we were at least neutral on. The disappointments came with general business legislation impacting industries across the board.

I want to thank the members of the OBA Legislative Committee for their efforts at helping me understand how bills might affect our member companies. The insights and feedback the committee offered are truly helpful and appreciated.

The OBA testified on a few bills this session and impacted others while not having to testify. Here are a few of those bills:

- House Bill (HB) 2370 This bill increased the fees that public utilities pay to the Oregon PUC. OBA confirmed and ensured that our members who are public utilities were not included in the bill.
- **HB 2851** Would have made a slight change in existing language to include infrastructure elements other than fiber were included in the definition of critical infrastructure. The ACLU opposed this minor change and we were not able to get the changes adopted.
- **HB 3148B** This bill made the OTAP assistance plan permanent and changed its name to Oregon Lifeline. It repealed the OTAP Advisory Committee and the bill also allows for one time assistance for purchasing internet enabled devices.
- Senate Bill (SB) 4 This bill would mandate customer bill credits for internet outages lasting longer than one hour, regardless of the reason for the outage. We and our industry partners were able to successfully kill this effort. However, I believe the legislature has tipped their hand related to broadband issues like this one. We must remain vigilant about customer credits and state mandated low-income offerings.
- SB 330 If passed, would mandate that electric service power lines be undergrounded. This bill had good intentions (fire prevention) but would have been very expensive. Again, OBA and our friends in the electric utility business were able to ensure it did not pass. The bill's proponent did say he would re-visit the issue in the future so... stay tuned.
- **SB 426B** is probably the worst bill that passed that impacts OBA members. The bill makes owners liable for wages not paid to sub-contractors, even if you have already paid the general contractor. While the bill is meant to target those in the general construction industry, it applies to all.

The OBA came to the fight over this bill kind of late in the session. While it was pointed out that our members use specialized contractors unlikely to neglect their workers, the liability in the bill still applies to us.

We still continue to struggle with issues related to working in the public ROW. In particular, ODOT continues to withhold permits until certain work is performed in conjunction with tribal representatives. The OBA is reaching out to the involved agencies in an attempt at speeding up the process. While I have heard from a few folks about this, please let me know if you are experiencing delays in getting permits due to cultural item concerns or other issues.

I'm actively tracking legislative and regulatory issues on your behalf to ensure your interests are represented. If you have any questions, concerns, or if something is affecting your operations (USIC locates, anyone?), please don't hesitate to reach out. Your input helps strengthen our advocacy efforts.


