High Stakes in a Short Session

With a new year there will be a short legislative session here very shortly in February. As of the date of this newsletter we are aware of at least two bills that the OBA will be actively involved with:

- **Legislation to crack down on copper theft and the resulting destruction of infrastructure**
- **Legislation that if passed would impose a timeline for responding to search warrants**

Our OBA Legislative Committee has been monitoring and working on both of these issues. We will certainly support the first and work to ensure we can live with the second.

Additionally, there has been an unsubstantiated rumor that the legislature may attempt to raid the 9-1-1 fund of any reserve amount found there. This would not be the first time this has happened, if it is true. Whenever there is a shortfall of general fund dollars, the 9-1-1 fund is an easy target to go after. In the past, our association has attempted to push back—though without success—against legislative attempts to redirect these funds. Our attitude has been that our members collect those funds from our customers in good faith and they should be used for the intended purpose of supporting the 9-1-1 system.

Beyond that, there will still be a number of bills that are released early in the session that must be reviewed, though far fewer than the number of bills during a normal long session. This is due in part to the nature of a shorter session, as well as the simple fact that legislators are restricted in the number of bill drafts that they can ask for (as opposed to a longer session when there is no number restriction).

Once we review and identify any additional legislation to track, the Legislative Committee will meet and determine what position OBA will take on them. The hope is that there won't be more to track but if so, we'll address them as needed.

While it has been quiet on the regulatory front, OPUC staff are currently working on rules related to the Residential Service Protection Fund (RSPF) implementing changes passed by the legislature. Among other things, there will be a small but needed increase in the monthly support amount qualifying Oregonians receive.

What that said, this is your association, and we're here to advocate on your behalf. Please don't hesitate to reach out with any concerns, challenges, or thoughts—whether legislative, operational, or anything else on your mind. We want to hear from you and will do our best to help.

→ High-Speed Boost: Hunter Communications Launches Salem Fiber Service

Hunter Communications has officially launched its high-speed fiber internet service in Salem, marking a major expansion of the Oregon-based company's network. The rollout began with a ribbon-cutting ceremony at Pringle Community Hall, where local and state leaders highlighted the importance of reliable broadband for economic growth and community connectivity.

The phased deployment starts in Northeast Salem with residential customers, with additional neighborhoods and business service coming in 2026. Hunter CEO Michael Wyschenk emphasized the company's commitment to bringing fast, dependable internet to Oregon communities, noting that the investment strengthens both digital access and local quality of life.

State Representative Kevin Mannix and Salem Area Chamber CEO Tom Hoffert also spoke, recognizing the positive impact reliable fiber infrastructure will have on residents and small businesses.

Hunter's Salem project is part of its broader effort to expand its 3,000-mile fiber network across Oregon, prioritizing safety, reliability, and customer-focused service.

Electrical Licensing Pilot: Complete & Implementing Feedback

The Oregon Broadband Association has officially completed a pilot program for its new Limited Energy Technician (LEB) Licensing Course—an initiative designed to help members fast-track the licensing process while reducing the cost and time barriers of traditional apprenticeships.

Developed in partnership with a credentialed industry expert and with the guidance from the Building Codes Division, the program blends a hybrid experience of classroom instruction, independent study and on-the-job experience for qualified telecommunications employees. We are in the process of refining the course before it's made available association-wide in 2026. We have received feedback around course length, simplifying the material and aligning both student/manager expectations. If you are considering sending an employee through the course or are contemplating taking it yourself, it is important to understand the commitment it takes to be successful. Fast tracking the requirement does not equal the ability to fast track effort, for sure!

We will be looking for our next small group to start a 10-week course. Email [Mandy](#) or look for her email if you are wanting to get started.

CO-IT Seminar Recap

In November, the Central Office and Information Technology Committee hosted the annual CO-IT Seminar in the scenic town of Hood River. 
